POLICE FORCES

- (1) A modern police force in most countries is chiefly concerned with preventing crime and, when crime has taken place, with detecting the offender and bringing him to justice. It has a duty to discover all the circumstances of the crime, to collect evidence to show that a crime has been committed, and who has committed it.
- But the police are not concerned only with crime, they also have a duty to maintain public order and safety in the brodest sense. Thus they control and direct crowds whenever they assemble for any purpose or occassion, such as a national ceremony, a political demonstration, or a sporting event. They nor mally do this with out using force, but in extreme circumstances; for example a riot, they may have to charge a crowd either on foot or on horseback, armed with batons, in order to prevent more violence.
